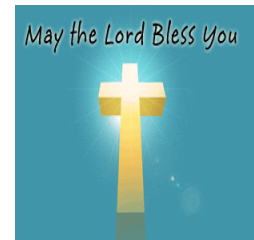

From the Spiritual Guy

As a liturgical person I hold special love for the worship service especially the give of the Last Supper that we celebrate together. The Eucharist, Holy Communion, Lord's Supper, Blessed Sacrament or whatever name your worshiping community calls the celebration of the bread and wine is for me the highlight of any worshiping time. As a priest I fill at awe during the moments of consecration whether I am saying the words and listening to someone else. In my tradition the consecration is fairly formal with special hand movements assigned by tradition and the distribution of the bread and wine is normally done by licensed lay people of clergy. While this is "occasionally" allowed

to vary, the rubrics or rules are fairly fixed. At our last Ultreya together, I had the privilege to share the Sacrament in a true Communion with the community of DCC. Gene Golish said the words of institution with the bread and wine and then we gave these elements to each other using the words that were traditional for each of our individual traditions. It was one of those "awe" moments that took me back to the mountain-top. It reminded me that one of strengths of our community is our diversity. We come from all walks of life with religious backgrounds that have our belief is salvation through Jesus as our common denominator and often little else. Cursillo and our commu-

nity often use a rainbow as a sign of who we are and when you think about it, without the various colors (differences) the rainbow would be bright, but not glorious. With one flat color the arc in the sky would be pretty, but bland. I think that is our community. Our various backgrounds, beliefs, worshiping methods and personalities make us a better people. The next time you celebrate the Supper, think about your many friends that are sharing the gift each in their own tradition and remember the many colors of our DCC family. Peace,
